Thank you for consulting Sport England on the above application.

It is understood that the site forms part of, or constitutes a playing field as defined in The Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (England) Order 2010 (Statutory Instrument 2010 No.2184).

Sport England has therefore considered the application in the light of its playing fields policy. The aim of this policy is to ensure that there is an adequate supply of quality pitches to satisfy the current and estimated future demand for pitch sports within the area.

The new stadia will affect an existing rugby training pitch which will be replaced by a new rugby training centre (with 3 new pitches) at Oil Mill Lane, EX5 1AF (planning ref 11/1277/MFUL) which has been approved by East Devon District Council. That meets E4 of our playing fields policy regarding replacement playing fields.

From the information provided we are satisfied that the proposal for three new stands at Sandy Park meets one of the exceptions of the above policy (E2) in that:

The proposed development is ancillary to the principal use of the site as a playing field or playing fields, and does not affect the quantity or quality of pitches or adversely affect their use.
